

We Invite You To Enter The Kings Fair!

Why? It's the best way to enjoy the fair. You can take advantage of our Special Exhibitor Pass that allows admission to the fair EVERY DAY! That way you'll be sure to see, hear and do all that's fun about the annual fair!

What do you do? Find your favorite category, select the correct form in the back of this book and submit it (the form, not the item) by the entry deadline.

The Adult Entry Form is to be used by all exhibitors 18 years of age or older. This form is also juniors wishing to enter and be judged in an adult division. Please use a separate entry form for each department you enter, i.e., Home Arts, Art, Floral, etc.

The Junior Entry Form is to be used by all exhibitors under the age of 18 entering in a Junior Division. You may use one form for all your entries, unless you are entering a 4H, FFA Division and a Junior Division, then you would need a form for each department. 4H, FFA, Open Junior are departments.

The Livestock Entry Form is used for large livestock, showmanship and special livestock contest entries. Please use separate entry forms for MARKET and BREEDING livestock and do not mix species on a single form. Enter BEEF, SHEEP and SWINE SHOWMANSHIP on a Market Form even if you are using a breeding animal. The entry fee for livestock is \$5/class and a mandatory \$10 fee for a Livestock Exhibitor Pass. Showmanship must be pre-entered and a fee of \$2/class paid at time of entry. A Mandatory Muck-out fee of \$5 per head entered is also required.

OFFICIAL STATE RULES

The Kings Fair is a District Fair of the State of California Department of Food and Agriculture under the direction of the Division of Fairs and Expositions. **Year 2007 State Rules** for California Fairs may be obtained from The Kings Fair Office located at 801 S. 10th Avenue, Hanford, CA. 93230 or by calling the fair office Monday through Friday, 8 am to 5 pm, at 584-3318.

LOCAL RULES

Carefully read all of the State Rules and be governed by them. ANY PERSON NOT FOLLOWING THE STATE AND/OR LOCAL RULES WILL NOT RECEIVE PREMIUM AWARD MONEY. The law has been made by the legislatures of the State of California and is contained in Section 4501 of the Food and Agriculture Code, which governs the operations of state owned District Fairs.

1. The Board of Directors and Management of the 24-A DAA has the right to refuse the display of exhibits deemed unsuitable in any aspect of the fair.
2. Management of the 24-A DAA has the right to extend any and all entry deadlines at their discretion.

3. **CLASSES:** Unless stated otherwise, all classes limited to residents of Kings, Fresno, Tulare, Kern, San Luis Obispo and Monterey Counties with the exception of all Junior Department classes.
4. **ENTRY FORMS:** Must be on official Kings Fair Entry Form and must be received at fairgrounds office or postmarked no later than Friday, June 1, 2007 at 5 pm. Fair management not responsible for errors on Entry Forms.
5. All divisions or classes will be judged under the American system and/or Danish system as stated in each department.
6. No exhibitor shall receive more than two cash awards in any one class under the American system. Any limitation within the Danish system of judging shall be printed where applicable.
7. Fair management is not responsible for errors in entries. Reasonable precaution will be taken in protection of exhibits; The Kings Fair will not be responsible for loss or damage, whatever the cause. No exhibitor shall be entitled to an award which has been disallowed as the result of his/her own error.
8. Exhibitors found in violation of rules or unethical or inimical with the fair program shall be penalized by forfeiture of premiums awarded and/or privileges as may be deemed appropriate to the circumstances. Management shall report any such exhibitors to the Division of Fairs and Expositions in writing and such reports may become the basis for any other fair to refuse entries.
9. The fair management shall withhold the payment of awards for exhibits that are determined ineligible under State and Local Rules and may recover awards that have been paid for ineligible entries.
10. A judge's decision is final. Fair management may not request any changes in judge rulings.
11. **No person shall be allowed to interfere with the judge(s) during the decision making process.**
12. **Personal criticisms by an exhibitor, parent, and leader of an exhibit or exhibitor belonging to that person or another person are considered unethical and will result in disciplinary action.**
13. The judge shall have the authority to:
 - a. disqualify or transfer to the correct class any exhibit which does not meet the requirements of the division or class in which it is entered.
 - c. disqualify any exhibit not properly cleaned or fitted.
 - d. disqualify any animal that is in his/her opinion hazardous to public safety.
 - e. examine animals before entering the show ring; and/or
 - f. refuse to award premiums to any animals which show visible evidence of disease, deformity or lameness.
14. Placement of ribbons on exhibits for display may not necessarily be actual placing. Only the official judging sheet placing will be used for paying premium awards.
15. Ribbons will be awarded for first, second and

third place in each class according to merit; if without merit, they shall make no award under any circumstances. If an entry is disqualified AFTER judging is completed, the judge will not change the status of award given for other entries.

16. **SWEEPSTAKES:** Shall be awarded only when at least three separate exhibitors have achieved a combined point total of at least 25 points.
 - a. First Award 5 points; Second Award 3 points; Third Award 1 point.
 - b. To receive a sweepstakes award an exhibitor must have a minimum of 10 points.
 - c. Points will be credited to the exhibitor whose name appears on the entry form.
17. The judge's decisions on awards cannot be protested. Protests will be considered only if there has been a violation of State or local rules. Refer to State rule V.3 for proper procedure.
18. **LIVESTOCK EXHIBITOR PASS:** In addition to entry fees, the purchase of a special Livestock Exhibitor Pass (\$10) is mandatory for all large livestock exhibitors. It is optional for Rabbit and Poultry exhibitors. This pass includes one 4 day pass. **IF PASSES ARE LOST THEY WILL NOT BE REPLACED. ALL PASSES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE. NO LIVESTOCK EXHIBITOR PASSES MAY BE PURCHASED AFTER ENTRIES CLOSE.**
19. **SPECIAL EXHIBITOR PASS:** All other exhibitors (not listed above) may purchase a Special Exhibitor's Pass (\$12) by bringing an Exhibit Claim Check to the main office **THE DAY YOU BRING THE ITEM IN FOR JUDGING.** For more information on this pass please call the fair office. **IF PASSES ARE LOST THEY WILL NOT BE REPLACED. PASSES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE.** We strongly encourage all fair exhibitors to take advantage of the Special Exhibitor Pass. Spend as much time as you can at the fair.
20. **SEASON PASS:** Non-exhibitors may purchase a Season Pass for \$18.00. The pass allows you to visit the fair everyday at a reduced rate. **IF PASSES ARE LOST THEY WILL NOT BE REPLACED. PASSES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE.**
21. **PARKING PERMITS:** These car tags will be issued for the following purposes only:
 - Gate A - Livestock Parking - One per livestock exhibiting family.
 - CVC Lot, Stock Truck/Vendor/RV and Fair Officials (Directors, Management, etc.)

NO EXHIBITOR'S CAR WILL BE PERMITTED TO PARK ANYWHERE ON THE GROUNDS EXCEPT IN DESIGNATED PARKING AREAS AFTER THE OPENING OF THE FAIR.
22. **EXHIBITS DELIVERY DATE:** Dates for exhibits to be in place or delivered for judging are listed at the beginning of each department.
23. **EXHIBIT REMOVAL: Livestock:** All persons exhibiting livestock will be required to obtain Livestock Exhibitor's Release Pass before

leaving the Fair. NO LIVESTOCK OR DECORATIONS (Except replacement heifers and hogs) will be removed from the fairgrounds before 9 pm on Sunday, July 15, 2007. Livestock release slips must be obtained from Livestock Office Prior to entering grounds with vehicles. OR EXHIBITOR MAY OPT TO REMOVE ALL PROPERTY BY 3 pm MONDAY, JULY 16, 2007.

Commercial/Informational Exhibit Booths: After the close of the fair, all displays must be properly dismantled and the space must be left in a neat and orderly manner.

All Other Exhibits: All other fair (non-livestock) exhibits will be released from the fairgrounds on Monday, July 16, 2007 between 7am and 11 am (unless stated otherwise). The Kings Fair will not be responsible for any exhibit, the care of, loss of or damage to any exhibit left as of 12 noon Monday, July 16, 2007.

ALL UNCLAIMED EXHIBITS WILL BE DONATED TO A CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION 14 DAYS AFTER THE FAIR ENDS.

24. **ADMISSION PRICES:**
- Adults (11 and over)\$6.00
 - Seniors (60 and over)\$5.00
 - Kids 6 through 10)\$3.00
 - Children (5 and under).....FREE

25. **PARKING:**
- LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS:** Exhibitors receive 1 (one) parking permit per family for the livestock parking lot. One Additional CVC lot pass available for \$8.00 for run of the fair.
- PUBLIC PARKING:** Public parking is available in the parking area directly north of the main gate and the CVC Lot at a charge of \$5.00 per auto each time entered on the grounds. The City of Hanford and The County of Kings will post "No Parking" signs on both Tenth Avenue and Hanford-Armona Road during the fair.
- HANDICAP PARKING:** A few spaces have been designated at Gate A for livestock exhibitors and at the main entrance to the fairgrounds to accommodate licensed handicapped fair goers.

MANAGEMENT WILL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR AUTOS TOWED AWAY FROM RESTRICTED AREAS

26. **FIRST AID:** For persons other than employees who are injured while on the fairgrounds, you must immediately notify a fair employee or security guard upon being injured.
27. **SIGNS:** Signs larger than a half card may not be displayed on any exhibit (except livestock barns). No advertisements shall be posted on the grounds or in buildings, except commercial exhibits.
28. **SOLICITING:** Not allowed under any circumstances.

29. **Dogs are not permitted on the fairgrounds** (guide dogs excluded). **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

1. All entries must have been completed within the last TWO YEARS and not previously exhibited at The Kings Fair. Entries limited to residents of Kings and Tulare Counties unless otherwise specified.
2. All works (fine art and photography) MUST BE TITLED.
3. All entries in photography MUST BE AN 8X10 PHOTOGRAPH AND MATTED. NO FRAMES, HOOKS, WIRES, STRING OR TAPE. Exhibitor is limited to two entries per class unless otherwise specified.
4. Entries are at the exhibitors own risk. Utmost care will be given to all entries; however, The Kings Fair accepts no responsibility for loss, stolen or damage of any kind to any entry. Your signature on the Entry Form is acceptance of this rule.
5. Exhibit MUST have proper hardware for hanging (wires and hooks) or exhibit cannot be judged. (Divisions 100-120).
6. Each artist may set a price for each entry, or list each entry as "Not For Sale". If no price is listed the item will be exhibited as "Not For Sale". All inquires regarding sale of entries will be referred directly to the artist to complete the sale.
7. The Kings Fair reserves the right to exclude an entry which is not in the best interest of the fair, and reserves the right to disqualify any exhibitor(s) who conducts themselves in an inappropriate manner, without discussion or justification. No payment of any awards will be made to individuals so disqualified.

DEFINITIONS

AMATEUR: An amateur may not have won more than five (5) Blue Ribbons at any competitive art show.

ADVANCED: An advanced exhibitor is one who has won between six (6) and ten (10) Blue Ribbons at any competitive art show.

ACCOMPLISHED: An accomplished exhibitor is one who has won over ten (10) Blue Ribbons at any competitive art show.

BEST OF SHOW: The current winner of Best of Show must move to the next level of competition the following year (i.e: if the winner of Best of Show is competing as an amateur this year, he/she must enter as advanced the next year).

NOTICE

Exhibits in the Floriculture Department must have been grown by the Exhibitor within the county of Kings, district or community represented by the Exhibitor, except classes for arrangements.

Florists and nurseries may exhibit plants, plant material and flowers which they currently sell but do not necessarily grow. Only persons licensed to sell nursery stock may sell plant materials which have been incorporated in displays.

EXHIBITS MUST BE ADEQUATELY AND CORRECTLY LABELED AND IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE EXHIBITOR, BEFORE JUDGING

The judge shall award 1st, 2nd, or 3rd place according to merit; and if without merit, the judge shall make no award under any circumstances. This rule applies whether there are one or more entries in the class.

2. **ORIGINAL** and **ACQUIRED** bonsai are accepted. All bonsai must be the sole property of the exhibitor. If **ORIGINAL**, no limits as to the creation are applicable to the artist. If **ACQUIRED**, the exhibitor must be able to show proof of ownership for a minimum of two (2) years. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to provide maintenance of their tree(s). **ACQUIRED** bonsai must be identified as such on the entry form. Entries that are not identified as to original or acquired will be assumed to be acquired.
3. Entries shall be identified by species of plant (botanical and common name) the age of the tree, (estimates are acceptable if exact age is unknown) and the bonsai style the artist determines the tree to be. In instances of a combination style bonsai the exhibitor must identify a single style for placement in a class. If a question arises regarding the appropriate class placement for particular bonsai, management shall have the right to assign the entry to a class.
4. Bonsai previously exhibited are allowed to return with the following exception: Bonsai that have won A Best of Show may not be entered to be judged for a period of three years following the year they won. Bonsai that have won a **FIRST** may not return to be judged for a period of two years following the year they won. Artists are encouraged to

- display past years winners in a special position of merit within the bonsai area.
5. The judges shall have the authority to transfer to the correct section or class any exhibit which is deemed to be entered incorrectly or in the judge's opinion should be transferred to another class or section.
 6. Judges shall also have the option of combining classes of exhibits if it is determined that there are insufficient entries in a particular class to offer competition. Should classes be combined, they shall be combined as follows: Broom styles and Cascade styles shall be combined with the Single Trunk Glass, Group and Forest styles shall be combined with the Multiple Trunk Class. Rock Plantings, Shobin, Windswept and other styles may be combined with any appropriate Class at the judges discretion. They shall award a A Best of Show in Open Bonsai Art and 1st, 2nd and 3rd per class according to merit and it without merit, no award shall be made. This rule applies to whether there are one or more entries. In the instance where bonsai in a particular class are considered by the judges to be of equal merit, preference shall be given to the original work.
 8. **SALE OF EXHIBITS:** If your entry is for sale, **LIST SALE PRICE** on entry form. If your entry is **NOT FOR SALE**, indicate by writing **NFS** on the entry form. All sales inquiries will be referred directly to the exhibitor.
 9. Exhibitors found in violation of the rules or in practices unethical or inimical with the Fair program shall be penalized for forfeiture of any awards and or privileges as may be deemed appropriate to the circumstances.
 10. Entries must be in place by July 6th, 10 am, and remain on display for the duration of the fair.
 11. **NOVICE:** One who has not displayed a bonsai at any judged venue and has less than two years experience within the art. Only original work is allowed.

STATE RULES APPLY WHERE LOCAL RULES OFFER NO DEFINITION

An Exhibitor found in violation of established local or state rules is subject to disciplinary action deemed appropriate by Board of Directors and/or Management of The Kings Fair:

The Kings Fair has established new rules for show attire for all livestock exhibitors. Refer to individual exhibitor section for new attire. No exhibitor will be allowed to show or exhibit wearing blue jeans, open toe shoes and polo or tee shirts.

CALIFORNIA GRANGE EXHIBITORS

All youth must be 9 years old by January 1, 2007 at the Kings Fair to exhibit large livestock animals. To show small animals (i.e. poultry, rabbits & pigmy goats) must be 5 years old by January 1, 2007. Livestock classes if not appropriately deemed by management to be full they will be transferred to 4-H or FFA classes at appropriate age or weight level.

New Show Attire: Official competition uniform of the Grange Youth Fair program shall be worn by all exhibitors: White pants; white long sleeved button-front dress shirt with collar; black/brown leather belt, black/brown boots and official red waist vest with Grange emblem on the back. All other official Grange rules apply.

FFA CHAPTER MEMBERS

FFA members in good standing are entitled to compete in the FFA department for one calendar year following the year in which they graduate from high school.

New Show Attire: All FFA Exhibitors of livestock must wear the official show uniform while showing their animals, which shall consist of FFA Jacket, tie/scarf, white pants, white shirt and closed in shoes. Hats and/or head gear of any kind SHALL NOT be worn with official show uniform.

4-H CLUB MEMBERS

4-H club members must be 9 years old or in the 4th grade as of January 1, 2007. Exhibitors are eligible

to compete through December 31st of the year they turn 19.

New Show Attire: Every 4-H Club member must wear the 4-H Club uniform while showing their animals. This uniform consists of 4-H cap, white pants, white shirt, and tie/collar and closed in shoes.

4-H Club projects MUST be regularly entered in the records of the Extension Service 60 DAYS PRIOR TO THE OPENING DATE OF FAIR. Market Steer projects must be entered 120 DAYS PRIOR TO THE OPENING DATE OF FAIR.

INDEPENDENT JUNIOR EXHIBITORS

Independent Exhibitors, 9 to 17 years as of January 1, 2007 (for the Kings Fair) of age may enter 4-H or FFA Divisions, or Independent Divisions where available. Those under secondary school grade level shall enter the appropriate 4-H Divisions, all others must enter the appropriate FFA Divisions.

New Show Attire: must wear white pants, white shirts and closed in shoes when showing livestock (no polo or tee shirts).

TO EXHIBIT LIVESTOCK, INDEPENDENT JUNIOR EXHIBITORS MUST NOT HAVE BEEN IN A JUNIOR ORGANIZATION WITHIN 30 DAYS PRIOR TO FAIR (60 DAYS FOR MARKET ANIMALS OTHER THAN BEEF; 120 DAYS FOR MARKET BEEF CATTLE) TO BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE. Independent exhibitors MUST HAVE ON GROUNDS' SUPERVISION BY A COMPETENT ADULT. Independent Exhibitors must show proof of insurance by their home owner's policy or must purchase insurance from CFSA. Contact the fair office.

RULES & REGULATIONS

Entry Forms must be properly filled out, must be approved and signed by the agriculture leader/advisor to the effect that the exhibitor is an active member in good standing of the respective organization. Parents or guardians must certify the Entry Forms for all Independent Exhibitors.

Only residents of Kings County or members in good standing of Kings County 4-H Club, FFA Chapters or Grange Organizations may exhibit at the Kings County Fair, unless otherwise specified. Breeding divisions of beef, goats, swine and sheep, are open to Tulare County 4-H/FFA Members.

LOCAL RULES

1. All market animals must be contracted to show at the Kings Fair. Contracts for market beef are due March 15, 2007. Contracts for market swine, sheep, goats and feeder steer calves are due May 11 & 12, 2007. All market sheep must be ear tagged and tattooed in addition to being contracted. This ear tagging and tattooing will take place at the Kings Fairgrounds on Friday, May 11, 2007 from 1 p.m. until 5 p.m. and Saturday, May 12, 2007 from 8 a.m. until 11 a.m. There is no limit on the number of animals you may contract or ear tag. There are entry limitations addressed elsewhere in the book.

2. If, after an animal has been contracted and/or tagged, you need to replace the animal due to death or broken limb you must notify a fair official and that animal must be inspected by a fair official. In the case of market beef, replacement must be no closer to the fair than 60 days. For all other market animals, replacement must occur no closer to the fair than 30 days.
3. Supreme Champion and Reserve Supreme Champion animals for each specie (sheep, steers & hogs) will be terminal and must be shipped by fair staff from the fairgrounds directly to a processing facility.
4. **Independent Exhibitors must purchase insurance from CFSA. Contact the Fair Office.**

All livestock exhibitors must purchase a Livestock Exhibitor's Pass (\$10.00) in addition to paying the required Entry Fees. A 4-H Leader, FFA Advisor or Grange Leader from each chapter or club must be on the fairgrounds AT ALL TIMES

The ownership rule shall be waived for individuals enrolled in livestock projects who reside in correctional facilities or public facilities for the physically, mentally or emotionally impaired. Junior Livestock Department Entry Forms will be provided by the Kings Fair and Entry Forms MUST be certified by the supervisor of the facility. These exhibitors shall be termed "Independent Juniors" and will be subject to the same rules as the independent exhibitors, including uniform requirements.

SALE ENTRY LIMITATIONS

Exhibitors are allowed to enter three (3) market animals and one (1) Replacement Heifer or Yearling Heifer (Sale). Exhibitors **WILL BE** allowed to sell one (1) Market animal **AND** one (1) Breeding Sale animal. Should they have two overall Supreme or Reserve Supreme Champion Market animals and a breeding animal they will be allowed to sell all three.

All Market Supreme Champions and Reserve Supreme Champions MUST sell at the auction and must leave the fairgrounds as a terminal project shipped by fair staff.

All livestock classes will be limited to two (2) entries per exhibitor per class except when absolutely necessary to make breeding animal groups or if market animals fall within the same weight class. Animals entered in registered classes or are eligible to show as registered animal may not be transferred or shown in grade or unregistered classes UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES.

Animals entered in market/sale classes may not be shown in breeding classes or vice versa.

LOCAL

Registration papers on registered animals must be verified by livestock management the day before they show. All first place winners in each class must present registration papers immediately upon

placing for visual verification of ownership at ringside.

STATE

1. Market beef must be owned 120 **consecutive** days prior to fair; 60 **consecutive** days for market sheep, swine, feeder calves and goats.
2. Breeding and feeder animals must be owned 30 **consecutive** days prior to fair.
3. Rabbits and poultry must be owned 30 **consecutive** days prior to fair.
4. All animals in "Registered Purebred Breeding Animal" divisions must be registered and recorded with a **United States (U.S.) Breed Association** in the exact name of the exhibitor (owner) as declared on the entry form.
5. **Joint Ownership - Breeding Divisions - No livestock (excluding rabbit and poultry) owned solely by a chapter or club, or conducted as a joint project by two or more individuals, is eligible in the junior department, unless the division or class specifically so states.**
6. Scrapie Requirements for Sheep and Goats: All sheep & goats must have scrapie tags in their ears supplied by the breeder when they arrive at the fairgrounds.

REMINDER!!

Exhibitors showing more than one market animal must advise livestock superintendent which one they are selling within 15 minutes of showing their last animal. Failure to declare will result in all animals being scratched. No exceptions!

The livestock office will be open Monday, July 9, 2007. Barn assignments will be posted at that time. We suggest you wait until security is in place (Wednesday, July 11) to begin work on your display area. We are located in the Livestock Barn Area, 583-0771.

Animals may arrive on the grounds NO SOONER THAN WEDNESDAY, JULY 11. Gates will open at 5am. All animals must be in place by 7 pm. NO ANIMALS ALLOWED ON GROUNDS PRIOR TO THIS SCHEDULED ARRIVAL TIME! ALL EXHIBITORS WILL BE TURNED AWAY PRIOR TO DESIGNATED TIME. NO EXCEPTIONS.

All market and feeders will be weighed upon arrival beginning at 7 am, Wednesday, July 11, 2007. Weighing of livestock will be completed by Noon on July 11, 2007. All brand inspection and health checks will be completed at the scales.

Animals will be weighed once, electronically. If there is a disagreement regarding the weight, the animal will be removed from the scale, the scale zeroed and the animal will be re-weighed. This weight will become the official weight. The animal will not be allowed to leave the scale area during the testing procedure.

Animals failing to meet the required minimum weights will be classified as feeders and allowed to

show in a feeder class. There will be only one class of feeders for each species; all organizations combined. Underweight animals are not eligible to sell at auction.

Overweight Animals: Animals exceeding the stated top weights will be classified in a Super-Heavyweight Class, allowed to show and sell if meeting all other standards. Super heavyweight animals will sell at top weight listed of each species and will be allowed to compete for champion.

There will be no premiums paid in any market animal class.

Prior year's Round Robin winners are eligible to compete in showmanship classes and future Round Robin Divisions as often as they win eligibility.

PARKING for stock trailers and trucks is expected at the CVC parking area or to be TAKEN HOME. No trucks or trailers are to be left in the fairgrounds livestock parking lot during the fair - THEY WILL BE TOWED AT OWNER'S EXPENSE.

Livestock exhibitors will receive one (1) parking pass per family for the livestock parking lot. Additional season parking passes will be available for parking in the CVC lot across the street from the livestock area for \$8.00.

ANY PERSON WHO COPIES THEIR PASS (ES) OR ALLOWS THEM TO BE COPIED WILL BE DISQUALIFIED FROM THE SHOW IMMEDIATELY. ANY AWARDS EARNED OR SALES MADE WILL BE CANCELED AND EXHIBITOR MUST REMOVE ANIMALS FROM THE GROUNDS, SURRENDER THEIR PASSES AND WILL NOT BE ALLOWED BACK INTO THE LIVESTOCK AREA.

FIRST BEDDING will not be provided. Sheep, Hogs and Goats are to be bedded with shavings; Cattle exhibitors may use shavings or straw.

BARN DECORATIONS & DISPLAYS must be designed to allow movement of air through the barn. Solid backdrops are prohibited. (Nothing more than 36" above the top pen panel is acceptable in Hog & Sheep Barn).

RED TAGGING will occur if stalls and pens are not kept neat and supplied with necessary clean bedding. Pathways must be kept clean for the convenience of spectators. Anyone not keeping his section of the barn clean and neat may be expelled from the Fair and no premium awards will be made to the offender. The Fair will provide men and equipment to remove refuse from the stock pile areas. All exhibitors must bring refuse to these specified areas. Exhibitors either not taking care of their animals or having stalls that do not meet the 'clean' criteria will be RED TAGGED. EXHIBITORS RECEIVING A 'RED TAG' ARE NOT ELIGIBLE FOR OUTSTANDING EXHIBITOR. Management will inspect the barns on a daily basis and "RED TAG" pens or stalls found in unsanitary condition. Any exhibitor receiving a second "RED TAG" will forfeit any awards earned. A third "RED TAG" will require exhibitor to remove the animal(s) from the

grounds, forfeiture of awards and exhibitor's pass. If exhibitor has already sold the animal the sale will be VOIDED.

FEEDING ACCESS for owners of livestock will be allowed through GATE B from 5am to 7am. Your vehicle must carry the necessary feed or bedding and will be allowed to enter for the purpose of caring for and feeding animals only. Exhibitors are not allowed to park in the livestock barn area or Lot "C". UNAUTHORIZED VEHICLES WILL BE TOWED AWAY AT THE OWNER'S EXPENSE. JUDGING WILL NOT BEGIN UNTIL ALL UNAUTHORIZED VEHICLES ARE REMOVED.

FITTING, HANDLING & SHOWING OF ANIMALS: Once an animal is entered in the junior livestock show and arrives on the fairgrounds, all junior show exhibitors must be actively involved and shall care for, fit, groom and wash their own animal. NO OTHER PERSON OTHER THAN THE EXHIBITOR, ADVISOR, LEADER OR THE EXHIBITOR'S PARENTS MAY ASSIST IN THE CARE, WASHING, GROOMING AND FITTING OF ANY ANIMAL. Any junior exhibitor or any advisor/leader or any exhibitor's parents violating this rule will subject the exhibitor to disqualification by the Livestock Superintendent. A decision by the Livestock Superintendent to disqualify an exhibitor for violation of this rule shall be final and shall not be subject to appeal.

SALE CHAMPIONS: (Supremes, Grand's, Reserves, etc.), MUST be displayed and remain in The Kings Fair Champion Row, which is an area provided to showcase champions by the Junior Fair Board. Failure to do so will cause forfeiture of the placing and all awards.

RELEASE OF ANIMALS: Exhibitors will be issued release slips starting at 9:00 pm Sunday July 15, 2007. Exhibitors are encouraged to wait until Monday morning to vacate the grounds. Animals left on the grounds after 1 pm on Monday July 16, 2007 will be charged stall fees at a rate of \$50 per head per day.

SALE CHECKS: The Fair Office will notify Advisors and Club Leaders when checks are eligible for pickup. **All add-on monies will be disbursed after all add-on monies have been received by the Fair Office from buyers - ABSOLUTELY NO PHONE CALLS REGARDING CHECKS.**

All Champions and Reserve Champion animals must sale. Violation of these rules a (2) two year suspension from the sale and showing (except poultry & rabbit meat pens). All animals must be moving soundly in order to go through the sale.**
3. **Animals must sell in order as listed in the Official Sale Book. Anyone missing their assigned sale order will be sold last.**
4. NO CHANGE WILL BE ACCEPTED ON THE SALES INVOICE OF CONSIGNMENT AFTER THEY ARE COMPLETED BY THE BUYER OR THE BUYER'S AGENT.
5. Ownership of animals passes to buyer at final bid. EXHIBITORS SHALL CARE FOR sale animals THROUGH SUNDAY OF THE FAIR OR UNTIL THEY ARE PICKED UP BY THE BUYER OR SHIPPED BY MANAGEMENT.
6. Animals may be shipped to processors immediately after the sale or early the following morning.
7. A sales commission of 4% will be deducted from each sale to defray expenses of the sales. An additional .0045% will be deducted from all market hogs sold (National Pork Board Check-off) and \$1.90 will be deducted from all cattle sold (Beef Council fee and Brand Inspection fees).
8. Exhibitors **WILL** be allowed to sell one market animal **AND** one breeding animal. Small animals included. Should they have two overall supreme/grand or reserve supreme/grand champion market animals and a breeding animal, they will be allowed to sell ALL THREE. **Exception** to this rule: If an exhibitor has a Champion or Reserve Champion small animal and a large animal that is not a Champion the small animal may be pulled in order to sale the large animal.
9. Trading of lower placed animals for higher placing ones after the sale is forbidden.
10. Advisors and Club Leaders will be notified

when checks are eligible for pickup. Add-on checks will NOT be paid until receipt of all add-on payments has been received by Fair Office. NO PHONE CALLS.

11. If an animal is purchased or signed by a family member of the exhibitor and it results in bad debt, until the balance is cleared, the fair reserves the right to refuse the entry of any other family members.
12. We encourage all exhibitors to secure a buyer for their animal **PRIOR TO THE SALE**.

2. American System of Judging applies. This is a non-sanctioned show.
3. Definitions and judging procedures as prescribed in the latest edition of the Official Show Rules and Standard of Perfection of the American Poultry Association, Inc shall

apply to all district and county fair poultry shows, except in such instances where they are in conflict with the rules and regulations prescribed by the Department of Food and Agriculture.

4. All birds **must** be brought to **gate A** for inspection. **No birds will be allowed onto the fairgrounds if they do not pass inspection.** All entrants will be given documentation showing that the bird passed inspection. This document must be shown to a poultry official at the barn before check-in.
5. Birds will be shown and judged in the proper division and class for breed, variety and sex only. If no class is offered, no awards may be made. Disqualified birds and those absent at the time of judging do not count when computing the number of exhibitors in the class.
6. A judge may excuse a bird from competition if it appears to be fatigued or out of condition, but the bird shall be counted as an entry. All Birds will be inspected by a licensed state inspector. If bird is sent home there are NO REFUNDS. No sick birds will be cooped. EXAMINE YOUR BIRDS CAREFULLY BEFORE ARRIVAL FOR CHECK IN.
7. ALL BIRDS MUST HAVE LEG BANDS. All classes of Poultry and other type of birds must be identified by leg bands conforming to the Entry Form upon arrival at the show.
8. Exhibitor is expected to feed, water and care or their birds.
9. Exhibitor must provide feed, water, and feed containers.
10. All exhibitors must sign up for barn duty. Sign up at the poultry barn at time of check-in. Sign up will be on a first-come, first-served basis. Number and length of shifts will be determined by the number of entrants.
11. Exhibitor **MUST** be a 4-H, Grange, or FFA member to enter showmanship.

They must be 42-45 days old at the time of show. **Failure to provide proof of age with entry will result in disqualification of birds.**
3. A meat pen consists of two chickens 42-45 days old and weighing 3-6 lbs. each.
4. All birds shall be weighed in by an official upon entry to the fair. They shall have only one weigh-in.
5. **NEW RULE:** Exhibitor can only sell **ONE SPECIE ANIMAL** at the Junior Livestock Auction. If the exhibitor has a Market Animal the exhibitor is to choose which animal to sell and notify the Poultry Superintendent and Livestock Office within half hour after the Market Animal has been judged.
6. Champion and Reserve Champion meat pens can sell at Junior Livestock Auction unless the exhibitor prefers to sell the Market Animal.
7. Blue ribbon winners may sell at the Junior Livestock Auction if that is the only animal being sold at Saturday's Auction.
8. Sold meat pens may be donated back to exhibitor, but not resold in auction.

ALL ENTRANTS MUST BE VERIFIED AS BEING CURRENTLY ENROLLED IN 4-H BY YOUR LOCAL UCCE OFFICE. Only parents of 4-H members or 4-H leaders can participate in the adult shoots. Each member and adult shooter must have a medical release form on site the day of the shoot.

1. Juniors will shoot at 10 yards (9 - 10 years).
2. Intermediate will shoot at 15 yards (11 - 13 years).
3. Seniors will shoot at 15 yards (14 - 18 years).
4. Adults will shoot at 20 yards (not telling).
"Fun Shoot"

The target to be used will be the 40 cm colored target. These targets are scored -10 plus the X ring. Any shot outside of ring will be a zero. The match will consist of 10 ROUNDS – 3 shots per round totaling 30 shots. There will be a 3 minute time frame per round.

Arrow must break target. If an arrow breaks the line, shooter receives the next highest score. **If shooter shoots more than 3 arrows that round will not be scored.** If there is a cross fire, shooter will lose the score for that arrow. Any arrow dropped within one (1) yard may not be picked up until the Range Master stops the line and clock. After line is safe, shooter may shoot the arrow. If arrow is dropped further than one (1) yard from the shooting line, shooter may not retrieve this arrow to shoot. Shooter loses that shot (no score).

Shooting line will be straddled at each distance: 10 yards for Junior and 15 yards for Intermediate and Senior. Safety line will be located approximately 5 yards behind shooting line. The safety line will only be crossed by the shooters who are called forward to shoot. Bows will be placed on the bow rack behind line with arrows in the quiver or suitable storage.

There will be no talking between safety and shooting lines. Shooters may address questions to the Range Master as needed.

WHISTLE COMMANDS

Two Blasts: Archers to the shooting line

One Blast: Begin Shooting

Duck Call: Stop shooting immediately! Put arrows in quiver

AFTER THE WHISTLE COMMANDS

There is no coaching or talking on the shooting line. All problems will be addressed to the Range Master. Two warnings for Misconduct such as talking on the line, stepping over lines, or not following commands, any other safety violations such as pointing a knocked arrow toward another shooter would be an example of misconduct.

Practice rounds will be allowed at specified times for each match to be held. In the State Archery Match there will be 2 – 4 judges that will pull the

arrows and write down scores on the score sheets.
